ing the underlying reason for their child's struggles. These letters are so inspirational, and in the spirit of the season, I thought I would share one with you:

"It is with great pleasure that we share our testimony of our 10year-old daughter. She has struggled with school, specifically reading and writing, since first grade. We were thrilled to finally have an answer, but what we didn't know was that a year later we would be celebrating huge

successes in school for this sweet girl!

Dr. Hock had her immediately start vision therapy through the Evergreen Vision and Learning Center. This was intense; she had to work very hard at her sessions, but also at home each day. Ursula was her therapist and worked her really hard, but in a way that was fun for our daughter as well. She hit huge milestones and her eyes were working together! Ursula and Dr. Hock re-tested her and were extremely excited to see how far she had come, but there was still work to do. They suggested we start tutoring with Donna, in the same learning center, to help with our daughter's fluency now that her eyes were finally doing the work together. Again, she has had to work extremely hard, and Donna pushes her too, but in a way that our daughter is able to see is helping her. Now she plans her visits with Donna and brings in assignments she is struggling with and asks for help. Donna helps her, but works in her own agenda as well to keep this girl on the right track!

Our work isn't done yet. We still meet with Donna, and our daughter still works really hard, but we can tell you that this has been life changing in the best ways! She started 5th grade this year at grade level in every subject and continues to have the best school year academically that she has ever had! We will tell you that academics are not the only thing that has benefited in her life;

her sports have as well! This girl now hits the ball in softball like she never did before! The combination of Dr. Hock, Ursula and Donna have been the miracle we needed for our sweet girl and we will forever be grateful for them finding out what was going on with her, but also for helping her fix the problem and continuing to work with her.
